INFORMAL OBJECTION

This Informal Objection is filed by the Prometheus Radio Project against Stand-in Organization (hereinafter SIO) in its application for Construction Permit for a Low Power FM Broadcast Station in the community of Paris, Texas. According to the Commission's rules, an applicant for an LPFM station must certify its eligibility to own and operate an LPFM station at the time it files its application. SIO fails to provide documentation establishing its eligibility as a nonprofit educational organization, and is thereby inconsistent with Section 73.853(a) of the FCC Rules.¹ The instructions to Form 318 state that applicants "must submit complete copies of the documents establishing their nonprofit status, such as corporate charters or articles of incorporation," and that "[a]pplicants that fail to provide these materials are subject to dismissal."² We note that the Commission has previously dismissed LPFM applications for

failing to provide evidence of incorporation.³ Therefore, we respectfully request that the Commission deny or dismiss SIO's application.
